
Staff, Parents/Guardians, and Students: This notice serves to fulfill annual notification requirements in accordance with Section 763.93 of the Asbestos Emergency Response Act (AHERA). At Royal Palm Exceptional School, we offer a credit retrieval program called Edgenuity. This class was created to assist students with making up credits that they are missing and need toward graduation. This is an independent learning program in which students must be self-motivated to complete the coursework. This is a computer-based program which instructs them and then tests their knowledge in each segment. Teachers are here to assist them, monitor their progress, and provide encouragement.. The goal is to complete each course 100% with a minimum of a 70% grade average to earn credits.. So if your child is missing core credits (English, Math, Science, or

History) which are needed for graduation, talk with our school guidance counselor to see if our



credit retrieval program is appropriate for them.

Royal Palm, via the School Improvement Plan (SIP) process, is also identified by the FLDOE for Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI). Additional Unified School Improvement Grant (UniSIG) funds have been allocated to target and support Royal Palm's 4 areas of focus - graduation rate, student achievement (behavioral/referrals), student achievement (learning gains), and teacher retention. Out-of-Field Teachers

According to Florida Statute 1012.42, we must notify parents of students who are being taught by out-of-field teachers. A teacher is out-of-field until the coverage/endorsement for a class that he or she is teaching is issued by the state of Florida.
