


Ms. Fisher and Ms. Woodard 1st grade

Welcome to the 2020-2021 school year!!!!! Although things have changed during this pandemic, our love, care, concern, dedication as well as our desire to teach our students has NOT changed. This is my first year teaching at Royal Palm Exceptional School, however, I have been teaching for 9 years total. I received my Post- Baccalaureate Specialty degree in Mild/Moderate Special Education from Cal State, Dominguez Hills (right outside of Los Angeles, CA). I chose this course of study because of my passion for helping others in need, my desire to educate and inform this country's youth, who are also the future and also due to my life experiences, I wanted desperately to make a difference and be a positive role model to children who needed me!

Ms. Hawkins, my educational assistant in our class has been at Royal Palm for a total of 4 years and she has been a HUGE help to me! We collaborate and work together as a TEAM!!! Like the old adage says; "It takes a village to raise a child", I wholeheartedly believe in this saying and my classroom is conducted in this manner. We collaborate, work together and support each other 100%. We are very lucky to have her in our "village".

My goal this year is to increase each student's reading proficiency to grade level or as close to grade level as possible. We are currently working on sight words; reading them outloud, writing each word on flashcards to review them daily as well as looking for them in print and pointing each word out. The class is beginning to read decodable words, sentences and short stories. After reading stories we have been asking who, what, when, where, why and how questions to help us better understand what we are reading. We are also currently working on identifying and understanding nouns and verbs. In writing, we are practicing our letter formations as well as learning how to form a coherent sentence using capital letters to start and punctuation to end. In math, we have been learning about reading and interpreting bar graphs, picture graphs and tally charts! We are also raising tadpoles to learn about life cycles and watch how a tadpole grows into an adult frog.

Our Face-to-Face and Home-Connect students have been working very hard through all the new changes during these challenging times. Students have been working in all subject areas. In Reading, our students are learning about the four main parts of a story (character, setting, plot, and theme). In Math students are learning place value, in Science students are learning about properties of matter, and in Social Studies, students are learning about The Geography of Florida. Our students are using System 44 and Compass Learning for extra practice in reading and math. In Social Skills we are discussing and learning the importance of respecting our teachers and peers. We are very delighted to be working with your child and help them exceed in their educational goals.







Mrs. Eddy, Ms. Davis, and Ms. Thornton Elementary Life Skills: 3rd, 5th, & 6th grades

We are so excited to be back in our classroom to work and learn in this school year! We are eagerly waiting for Mrs. Davis to return to our class and are so grateful that Mrs. Thornton has returned to be with us another school year. Hooray! Our students are adjusting to our school schedule and have been working hard to practice our classroom and school rules. We are also working on bus safety to ensure appropriate behaviors are practiced going to and from school. We have been working very hard to wear our masks properly and wash our hands continuously throughout the day. We are doing a good job of keeping track of our materials and toys, since we cannot share items at this time.



We complete activities daily to increase our name identification. We journal daily to practice the day of the week, the day and month, of the year, the current weather, and identifying feelings, likes, needs, wants, and wishes. We practice spelling words daily to increase our word recognition. We are learning new vocabulary words weekly to increase our comprehension. Our daily read alouds are paired with crafts to demonstrate the meaning of the story. We have been working on counting, identifying less and more, rounding to the nearest ten and hundred, and place value. Please make sure you read with your child daily and ask them about their day. They are very proud of their crafts and are eager to share them with you. Thank you for your continued support!







Mr. Brown and Ms. Lader 4th grade

Welcome back! To help your child become a better reader, read with them every day for at least 10 minutes. You can read to your children or have them read to you at any point of time that is convenient for you. Expose your children to both fiction (make believe) and non-fiction (real) books. Some examples of non-fiction would be historical books or news articles, and some examples of fiction would be Captain Underpants or Dog Man. Students should also do 20 minutes of Compass Learn and Prodigy every day. A "learning path" is automatically generated based on your child's reading ability. They have access to this at home as well (compass.leeschools.net) and (Prodigygame.com). Another great online resource is FloridaStudents org

Ms. Wadley-Jackson and Ms. Anderson 3rd Grade

What's happening in Mrs. Wadley-Jackson's & Ms. Anderson's Class: The students have been testing the water in math by working with place value, addition & subtraction, rounding numbers to the nearest tens, hundreds, as well as identify associative property and commutative property. In the weeks to come the students will work their way into the challenge of multiplication. Moving right into science, the students have been learning all about the states of matter in solids, liquids, and gas. The students did a project where they had to look around the classroom and identify objects in the classroom that were a solid, liquid and/or a gas. The students were also excited to learn a song about the three states of matter which they were able to sing for a few staff members as they were doing a walk through the classroom. Now, the students are preparing themselves for the upcoming science lesson in which they will be discovering the art of energy and motion and they are excited and ready!

Lastly, in social studies the students for the past few weeks have been learning about the regions of the United States, the continents and the oceans of the world. Our students have also been discussing how to interact properly with their classmates and family members. They have been learning many strategies on how to be productive in their young lives, and how to make good choices in school and at home. This year we are faced with challenging situations due to the pandemic. The configuration of our class is very different. Some of us are face to face (F2F), while others are online in the Lee Home Connect Program (LHC). We are doing what needs to be done whether in class or at home in the pursuit of our educational endeavors. We are determined and motivated!

In class we are wearing our masks daily, practicing appropriate hand sanitizing and socially distancing ourselves to keep each other safe and healthy.

We are also diligently working on academics and behaviors. We are proud of the student's achievements. For this quarter, language has focused on asking questions, (5 Wh+H), comprehension, nouns, compound words, and vocabulary. In Math we are rounding numbers to nearest ten/hundreds. In science we are learning about the nature of science, and in social studies we are learning all about geography (maps, scales, cardinal and intermediate directions). Our character word of the month is acceptance and we are learning what it means to be accepted and how it is important acceptance is to healthy living.

Finally, required assessments, which include the STAR Reading and Math Test are almost completed. We are going to have a Great year! Reading tip: remember to set aside a time nightly (15-20 minutes) to work on reading skills by having your child read to you, or you reading to your child!!





Ms. Perl and Ms. Cruzado 4th grade

I am pleased to announce that our new Educational Assistant, Ms. Cruzado, will be assisting me and working with our pupils in various ways. Our students have shown a lot of excitement and interest in their school work since the beginning of this academic year. In math, we have begun to work on place value and reviewing addition and subtraction facts to get them thinking about math again. The class has also been increasing their vocabulary by using a dictionary, weekly spelling tests, practice reading orally as well as improving their handwriting skills. In addition, the students do a daily journal entry/writing prompt which helps them with their writing and grammar skills. Our students are beginning to work on our current science unit on flower and plant reproduction which will include follow up interesting review videos. The upcoming social studies unit will have the class learning about the geography of Florida and labeling the important geographical places in our state. Our monthly social skill unit is on acceptance where we discuss the importance of respecting one another and realizing each person is important and offers interesting and wonderful ideas to our class. Please have your child read every day for at least fifteen minutes. We are very excited to work with your child and I know this year the class will continue to work on their individual educational and socialization goals.

We are in the new age of technology! We're learning to navigate Zoom, while becoming more familiar with Google Classroom/Docs/forms and slides, in addition to Powerpoint. We continue to use the old online applications: Brainpop, Pearson Reading Street, and Go math, and Think Central. We've also become familiar with new apps, such as Nearpod and I-Ready toolbox lessons. Our hybrid class is rising to the challenge, brick and mortar and Home Connect alike. Mr. Murph and Ms. Harris 5th grade








Mrs. Morales-Kiesinger and Ms. Canderlaro 6th-8th Math

Ms. Senat, Ms. Jackson, & Mr. Vandevelde 9th-12th Life Skills



Mr. Mike Bursztyn Title 1 Parent Involvement and Family Engagement

As one of 45 Title 1 Schools in Lee County, Royal Palm Exceptional Center School receives additional funds for the purpose of improving student academic and behavioral achievement via teacher training, hiring additional staff (helping teachers, social worker, parent involvement teacher), purchasing instructional materials and supplies, offering parent workshops and parenting materials/ resources, and supporting and increasing parent and family involvement. Like all Title 1 schools, Royal Palm has a Parent and Family Engagement Plan (PFEP). Our draft 2020-2021 Royal Palm plan was discussed and reviewed last Spring as part of a "Zoom" meeting to obtain input and feedback, and it was part of the agenda during our Annual Title 1 Meeting via Zoom on September 22nd. During these meetings, parents, SAC members and staff provided input in the areas of defining activities that build capacity for strong parental involvement, staff training, and discretionary activities that relate to student achievement. Throughout the 2020-2021 school year we will have numerous school activities and workshops that you should attend. Naturally, due to COVID-19, there have been adjustments to how these activities will occur, with more emphasis on access via Zoom on-line communication, Google Forms, postings on our school website, and School Messenger phone calls, texts, and e-mails. I am working with Donna DJerf, District ESE Department Parent Liaison and Lanna Elrod-Flynn, District FDLRS Parent Services Specialist to present a parent workshop in October, and specific information will be communicated to you soon.

The more you are involved, the more your child will succeed, so let's work together to achieve positive academic, social and behavioral outcomes for all students at Royal Palm School. 

Out-of-Field Teachers

According to Florida Statute 1012.42, we must notify parents of students who are being taught by out-of-field teachers. In addition, the certification and/or endorsement must appear on his or her teacher certificate. Individuals who are teaching out-of-field are certified in a least one area and are qualified to teach, but are required to take additional coursework or testing to add a coverage/endorsement to their certificate.
