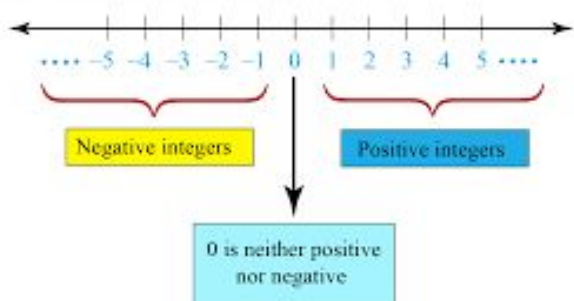

Graphing Integers on a Number Line

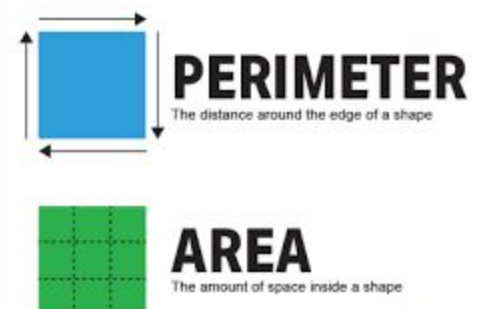

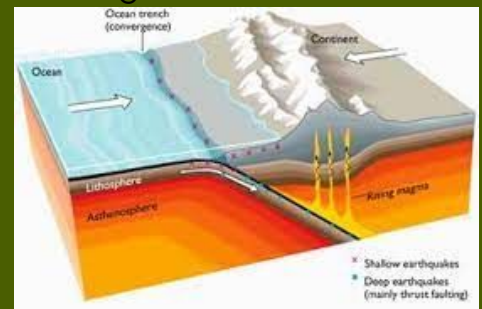

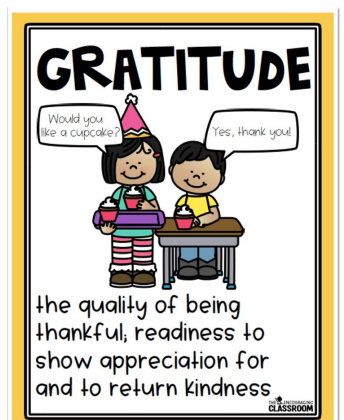
Ms. Brown & McMillian 6th-8th Science

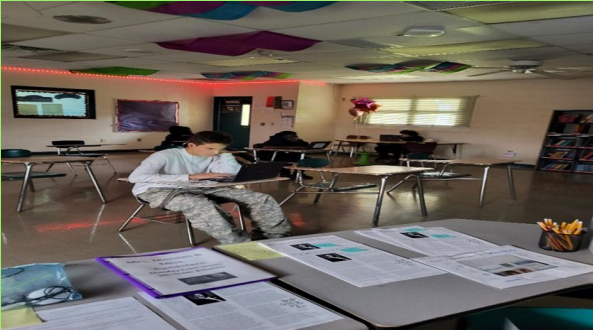

Important Message

Staff, Parents/Guardians, and Students: This notice serves to fulfill annual notification requirements in accordance with Section 763.93 of the Asbestos Emergency Response Act (AHERA). As required under AHERA, Royal Palm must maintain an Asbestos Management Plan (AMP) and keep the AMP on file at the school, and the School Administrative Unit Office. The AMP is available for review during school hours, Monday through Friday. Periodic surveillance of known asbestos in Royal Palm is performed every six months by a designated person to assess the condition of the ACBM. Six-month Assessment Results are maintained and are also available for review in the AMP.

Ms. Gallucci 9th-12th Credit Retrieval

At Royal Palm Exceptional School, we offer a credit retrieval program called Edgenuity. This class was created to assist students with making up credits that they are missing and need toward graduation. This is an independent learning program in which students must be self-motivated to complete the coursework. This is a computer-based program which instructs them and then tests their knowledge in each segment. Teachers are here to assist them, monitor their progress, and provide encouragement. The goal is to complete each course 100% with a minimum of a 70% grade average to earn credits. So if your child is missing core credits (English, Math, Science, or History) which are needed for graduation, talk with our school guidance counselor to see if our credit retrieval program is appropriate for them.

Out-of-Field Teachers
