


Ms. Brensinger & Ms. P. Hawkins 1st & 2nd grades


We have finished our i-Ready diagnostic assessments for quarter two and learning gains were demonstrated by most of the students.

In reading, we are working on improving comprehension, and other component parts of reading through employing context clues, listening skills, identifying main idea/details, point of view, and character descriptions. In social studies we have learned about different cultures and how they are similar and different depending on their locations or regions. In science we have learned all about light energy. In our Go Math we have learned key terminology pertaining to division, and how to use arrays, number lines, equal groups, multiplication, and how subtraction can help solve division problems.





Notification to Parents and Stakeholders of the Annual School Public Accountability Report (SPARS): NOTE - Royal Palm does not receive a school grade but does receive what the Florida Department of Education refers to as a School Improvement Rating each year. The most recent rating DOE assigned to Royal Palm was the 2018-19 rating of "Maintaining". This was an improvement over the rating for the prior year, partially due to increased student learning gains, and Royal Palm qualified for School Recognition Funds two years ago as a result. FLDOE has updated our school testing, learning gains and other data categories for the 2020-21 school year.
